

Learning Academy Partnership Parent Questionnaire Feedback

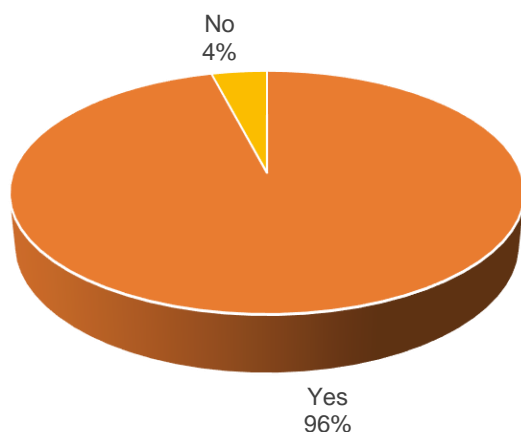

WHAT DID YOU TELL US?

Q1. My child is happy at a Trust school

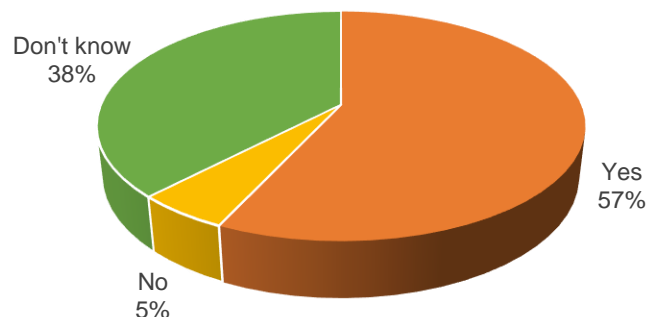


We are delighted that across our family of schools, 96% of our children feel happy attending their school. This is incredibly important to us and underlines the importance of one of our core beliefs, as a Trust, that everyone should feel that they belong 'Sense of Belonging'.

Q2. There is a positive benefit on my child's education by being part of a School Trust



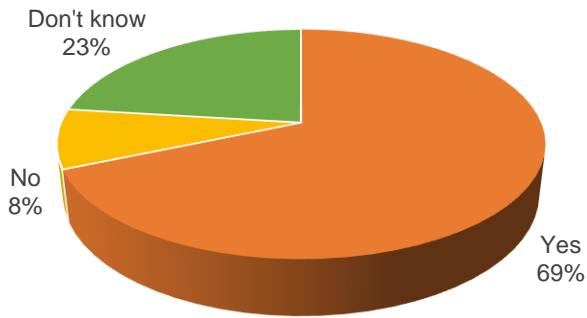
This is an improvement on last year which is fantastic, but we recognise that we have more to do here in order to ensure that all of our parents and carers understand the benefits for their children and their communities in being part of a wider family of schools. We will continue to work on sharing this with you throughout 2022-23 as the benefits are huge both in terms of the experiences that this family of schools together approach enables us to provide for our children but also what they gain from it in terms of being part of something bigger in terms of their social development. Interestingly our children tell us that they love being part of a big family and are really clear about what they see as the benefits, so we now need to get better at sharing this with our families! 'Realising the possible'.

Q3. The school's Christian values and attitudes have a positive effect on my child

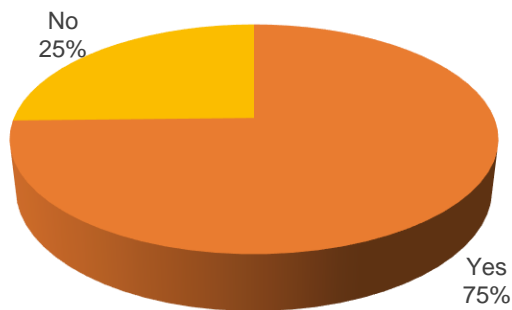

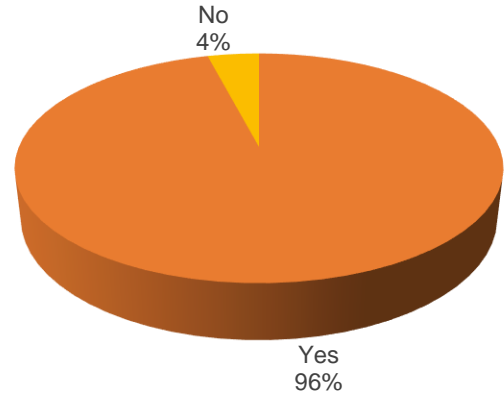
"Values are important, and I feel like this shines through all aspects of the school."

Q4. I receive helpful information about how being part of a School Trust benefits my child's educational journey



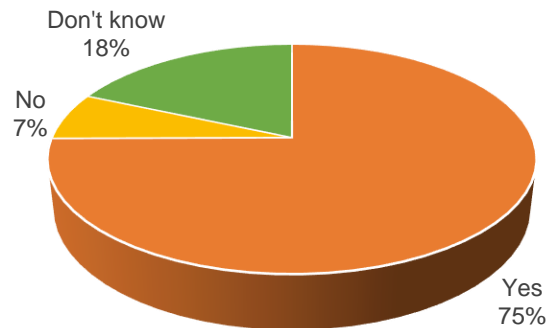
This is an increase on last year, which was 62%, and shows the improvements we are making are having an impact.

Q5. My child feels safe at a Trust school

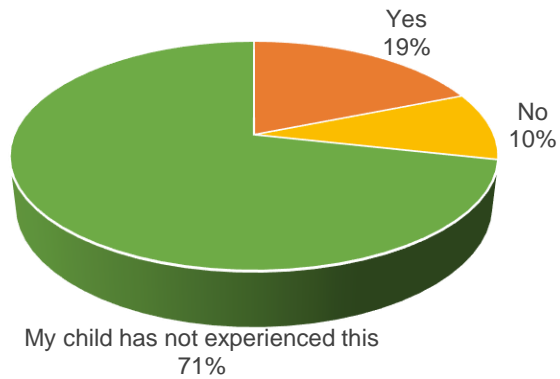


We are delighted that our children feel safe in their school, and this shows the impact of the way that we work to ensure that our children feel valued and secure and know how to keep themselves safe both physically and online.

Q6. The Trust schools make sure its pupils are well behaved

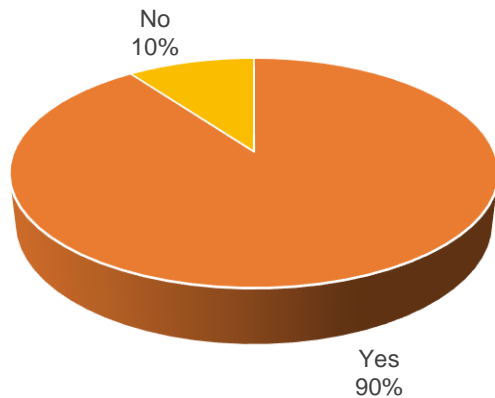


Q7. My child has been bullied and the Trust schools dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively



The majority report that their child has not experienced bullying. Of the 29% responses which did indicate that bullying had played a part in their child's journey, 19% felt it had been dealt with effectively. This is a significant improvement as previously a third felt we hadn't dealt with it effectively.

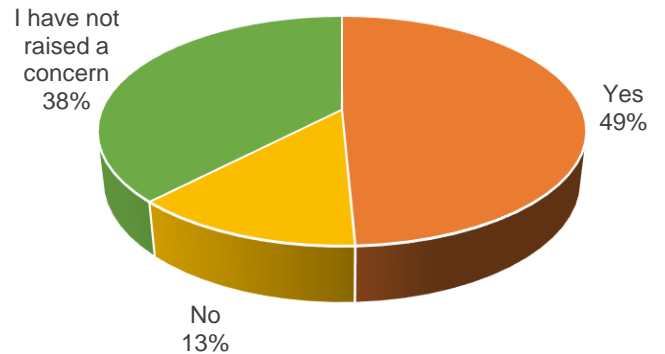
Q8. The Trust schools make me aware of what my child will learn during the year



This is a slight improvement on last year and shows the changes we have made to our newsletters and booklets is starting to have impact.



Q9. When I have raised concerns with the Trust schools they have been dealt with properly

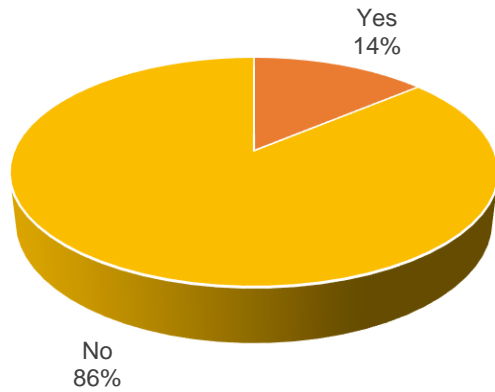


Whilst it is pleasing that 87% of our parent community have either not raised a concern or are happy with how any concern has been dealt with, we still have work to do to address the 13% who do not feel that concerns have been addressed properly. This will be an area for individual schools to look at closely.

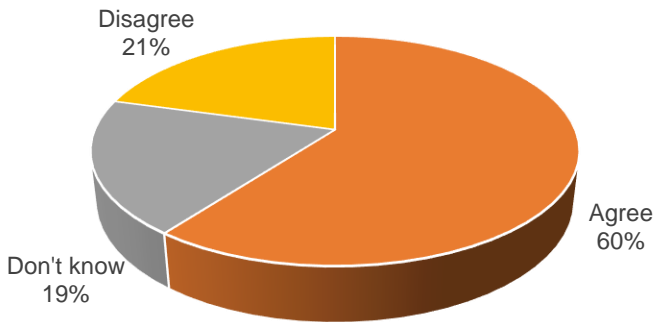

Q10. Does your child have special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND)?

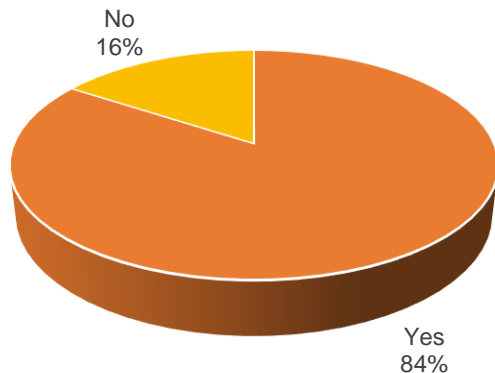


Q11. How strongly do you agree with this statement? "My child has SEND and the Trust schools give them the support they need to succeed."



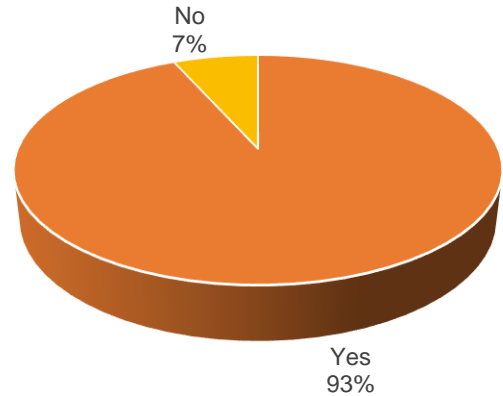
We know that this is an area of development for us as a Trust and we will seek to address and make progress in this area in 2022-23.

Q13. My child does well at a Trust school

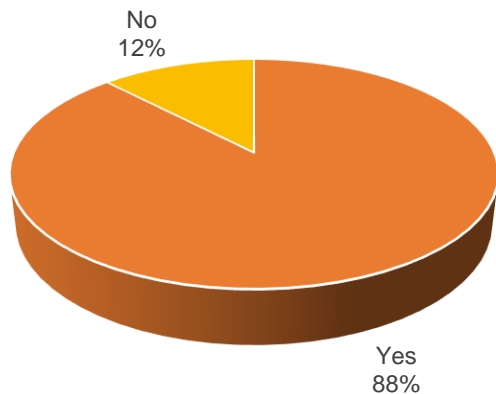

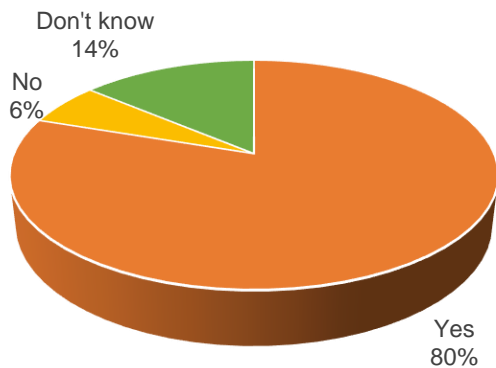
Q14. The Trust schools let me know how my child is doing

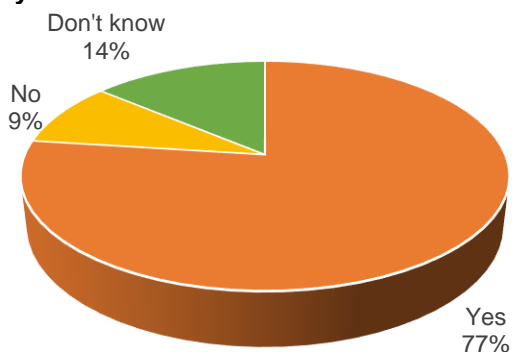
Q15. There is a good range of subjects available to my child at the Trust schools



This figure represents a significant improvement, and we are pleased that our children are receiving a broad and balanced curriculum offer and experiencing a full range of subjects.

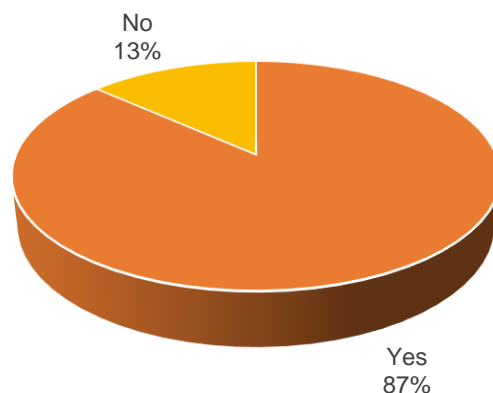
"My children are cared for as individuals and supported to thrive. They enjoy the range of interesting learning opportunities that are presented to them, which makes school an exciting place to be."
